

It is important that you help and monitor your child with Home Reading

We ask you to fill in the Reading Journals and projects that are listed in them.



DROP DOWN CURRICULUM

Each week children in year 1 & 2, year 3 & 4 and Year 5 & 6 will take part in a drop down curriculum.

This is to give children to learn life skills as well as collaborate with children from different classes.

In year 4 we are offering performing arts, problem solving, creative arts and design and technology.

In Year 5 & 6 we are offering – Performing Arts, Art, Cookery and Filming



BEHAVIOUR

Pupils in our school generally behave really well. However, part of Primary School is learning the social and learning behaviour needed to be successful.

We use 'Stay On Green' a whole school approach to Behaviour Management that rewards the Positives.

If a child does not follow the classroom and playtime expectations there is a clear structure for managing that behaviour. If your child is ever sent out of class, the teacher will inform you by text so that you can discuss your child's behaviour with them.

Bronze, silver and gold awards are given to children who demonstrate behaviour above our expected behaviour. Green.

- Violent and aggressive behaviour
- Racist language
- Homophobic language
- Stealing
- Bullying
- Insulting to someone's gender
- Insulting to someone because of a disability
- Not following an adult's instructions
- Swearing
- Defacing or damaging any school property
- Continually stopping other children from working or being able to concentrate.

E SAFETY


- E-Safety is becoming a bigger and bigger issue each year. We will be offering support and workshops to parents across the year to help you keep your child safe on line.
